Sustainability

Shacklewell is very proud of its partnership with Zero Carbon Schools. We are amongst the first schools in the country to calculate our carbon footprint. As you can see from the poster we have lots to be pleased about, particularly the figures for travelling to school. It does however raise some questions about the climate impact our food. The eco councillors, in partnership with the <u>Green School Project</u>, are already planning the next steps on how to improve these ratings, including utilising the green spaces in school to grow some of our own produce. This work is also complimented by the wider New Wave Federation sustainability group which is exploring strategic ways for the organisation to be as climate friendly as possible.

We are very proud to announce that Shacklewell has partnered with <u>Tender Education and Arts</u> to complete RE:SET; an online toolkit and whole school campaign to award our school for promoting a culture of healthy, equal and respectful relationships.
