Update from Mr McGrath

Welcome back to the new term.

Shacklewell has hit the ground running with some very interesting new curriculum topics and our engaging writing weeks. The children have also been demonstrating our values of collaboration, creativity, kindness, focus and responsibility throughout the school day- which has ensured a very positive start.

This half term we are really developing the children's identity as readers. Through assemblies, workshops and new approaches to sharing books in class, we want all our children to have a clear understanding of who they are as a reader. You can support us with this by taking your children to your the library each week and encouraging them to read for at least 10minutes a night. Reading really is the key that unlocks the whole curriculum so I know you will support the school with this important initiative.

To support you to know exactly what the children are doing in school, we have added a new Knowledge Organiser document to the $\underline{\text{Year I}}$ - $\underline{\text{6}}$ pages on the website. These include the key knowledge and vocabulary that each child needs for their current topic and will help you, when talking to them about their learning in school. In addition to this we have added our 'Reading Pathways' resources to the year group pages and this helpful $\underline{\text{Reading Overview}}$ to support your understanding of how we teach reading.
