### KEY VOCABULARY

CARTOGRAPHY	THE SCIENCE OR PRACTICE OF DRAWING MAPS
REGION	AN AREA OR PART OF A COUNTRY OR THE WORLD WITH DEFINABLE CHARACTERISTICS
LANDMARK	AN OBJECT OR FEATURE OF A LANDSCAPE THAT IS EASILY SEEN AND RECOGNISED
TERRESTRIAL	ON OR RELATING TO THE EARTH
ORIENTATION	THE ACTION OF MOVING SOMEONE OR SOMETHING RELATIVE TO SPECIFIED POSITIONS
BOUNDARY	A LINE WHICH MARKS THE LIMITS OF AN AREA
